> people with disabilities.


Medicaid is administered by states, according to federal requirements.

The program is funded jointly by states and the federal government


National Medicaid Landscape

2016 National Annual Expenditures by Payer (\$ Billions)






WV Medicaid Members in Working Family



66% of adult and child Medicaid enrollees in WV are in families with a worker.


Medicaid Members – County Distribution (2017)






Status of State Medicaid Expansion Decisions











Per Member /Annual Expenditures - 2017



FY 2018 – Expenditures by Major Category









Managed Care Enrollment (000s) – June 2018


